Parliamentary Education Office (PEO) Is NOT a Mandatory Institution but is highly recommended for schools where possible:

- a one-hour Parliamentary Education Office (PEO) hands-on experience of hour our Parliament works to make Australia a better place to live. (Group size minimum of 15 students required and Max 50 student and 5 adults per session (2 x sessions enter at any one time)
- a half hour break in the Queen's Terrace Gallery with the opportunity to meet your member of parliament dependent on their availability.
